- Some Systematic Methods For Bible Study:
 - A chapter a day.
 - Advantages: It's daily. Will take about 3 years to cover all.
 - Disadvantages: Not enough good as you grow, some chapters stop off in middle of a thought at times.

- Some Systematic Methods For Bible Study:
 - A book a day or week.
 - Advantages: You can keep it in context.
 - Disadvantages: A book a day is too much, some books are too long, and overbalance of O. T. study.

- Some Systematic Methods For Bible Study:
 - The bible in one year.
 - Advantage: Can keep check on how much you study.
