    - Some are in need of meat. **1 Cor. 3:1-3 (KJV)**
    - Some are in need of solid food. **Heb. 5:11-14**
  - Whatever the stage, a system of study is needed. **1 Cor. 14:40**

# Methods Of Bible Study

- Some Systematic Methods For Bible Study:
  - A chapter a day.
    - **Advantages:** It's daily. Will take about 3 years to cover all.
    - **Disadvantages:** Not enough good as you grow, some chapters stop off in middle of a thought at times.

# Methods Of Bible Study

- Some Systematic Methods For Bible Study:
  - A book a day or week.
    - **Advantages:** You can keep it in context.
    - **Disadvantages:** A book a day is too much, some books are too long, and overbalance of O. T. study.

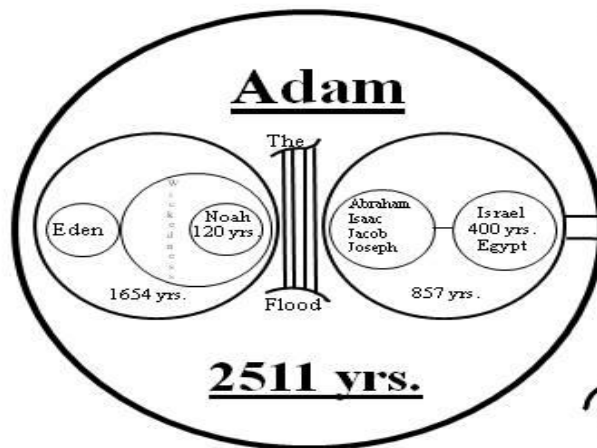

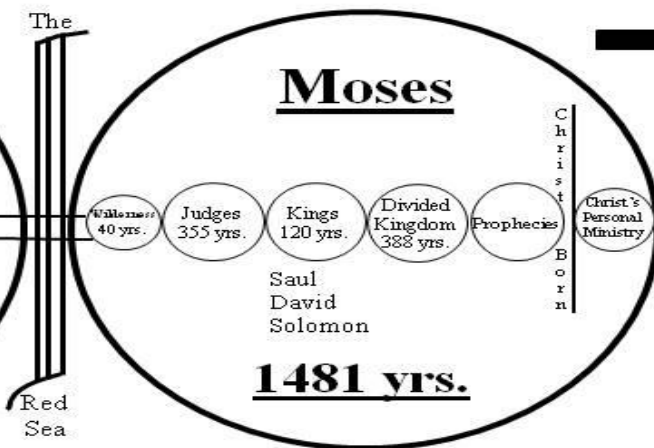

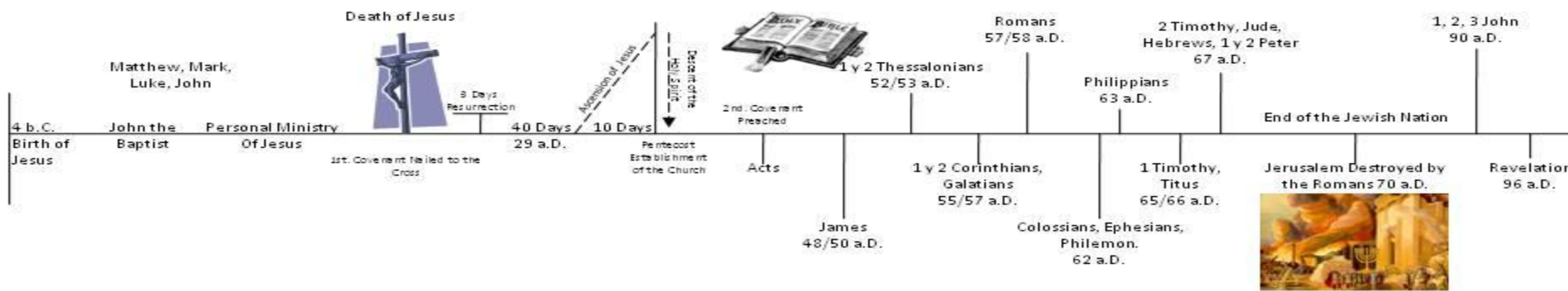
