

Rules Of Bible Study

- Law of Harmony
 - ■Truth is truth. *Jn. 17:17*
 - ■Do not speculate. *Deut. 29:29; 1 Cor. 4:6*
 - Consider all of God's word on any subject.

 Ps. 119:160
 - ■For example: *John 3:16, 36; Acts 2:38; 22:16*

Rules Of Bible Study

- Law of Harmony
 - Difficult passages need to be considered in light of plain language.
 - **Example:** 1 Cor. 15:29 vs. Mark 16:16
 - Elliptical sentence need to add word "only".
 - **■Examples:** 1 Cor. 1:17; John 12:44; 6:27

Rules Of Bible Study

- Law of Context
 - Good Bible study begins with a thorough evaluation of the context.
 - What is a context?
 - In bible study, context is the words, phrases, and sentences surrounding a particular word, phrase, or sentence.
 - **■** Why is context important? Consider: *Matt. 5:48*

- Determine <u>WHO</u> is speaking.
 - Is he inspired or not?
 - ■God *Gen.* 2:17
 - ■Devil *Gen. 3:4; Job. 2:4*
 - ■Jews *Jn. 8:48*

- Determine <u>WHO</u> is speaking.
 - Is he inspired or not?
 - Some statements, though spoken by uninspired men, are recorded by the inspired writer, and we need to be careful with these.

Example. John 9:31; Dan. 4:34-35; Acts 17:28

- Determine <u>WHEN</u> it was spoken?
 - ■In what dispensation? *Heb. 1:1-2*
 - Historical period
 - **■** Example: *Matt. 6:9-13*

- To <u>WHOM</u> is it spoken?
 - Gen. 6:14 "Make for yourself an ark of gopher wood"
 - □ Gen. 12:3 "I will bless those who bless you"
 - **Exo. 20:8** "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy"
 - □ John 14:26; 16:13 The Holy Spirit "will teach you all things" and "guide you into all the truth"

- WHAT were the surrounding circumstances?
 - **Examples:** *Acts 16:31; Luke 23:42-43*
