  - **■** Examples of figures of speech:
    - **■Ellipsis** words are left out. *Matt.* 11:18
    - ■Hyperbole exaggeration. 2 Sam. 1:23
    - Metonymy change of one noun for another related noun. Prov. 10:20

- Recognizing figurative language.
  - Examples of figures of speech:
    - ■Synecdoche transfer; exchange of one idea for another associated idea. Acts 20:7
    - Simile resemblance; a comparison by resemblance. Psalm 17:8

- Recognizing figurative language.
  - Examples of figures of speech:
    - Metaphor representation; a comparison by one thing's representing another. Matt. 26:26
    - **■***Irony* expression of thought in a form that conveys its opposite. *Judges* 10:14
    - Oxymoron wise-folly; a wise saying that seems foolish. 1 Cor. 1:25

- Recognizing figurative language.
  - **■** Examples of figures of speech:
    - **■***Personification* things represented as persons. 1 *Cor.* 12:15-16
    - Idiom peculiar usage of words or phrases.

      Matt. 12:40

- When can we know figurative language is being used?
  - When the statement presents an absurdity. Matt. 26:26-29
  - Terms are figurative when the literal meaning presents an impossibility.

Ps. 18:2; Matt. 8:22

- When can we know figurative language is being used?
  - Terms are figurative when the literal application contradicts plain teaching elsewhere.

    John 6:27; 12:44
  - Terms are figurative when action demanded are known to be wrong. *Matt.* 18:8
