 - God has never been pleased with laziness.
 Prov. 26:13-16
 - There is no excuse valid in the eyes of God.
 Matt. 25:24-30

- The high heel.
 - This shoe fits the haughty and proud individual.
 - How is a Christian to think?
 Luke 18:9-14; Rom. 12:3; Prov. 16:18
 - We are to think on things that will keep our feet on the ground, and our goal on high. Phil. 4:8

- The house shoe.
 - This shoe fits the individual that wants all things comfortable and faints when troubles come.
 Gal. 6:9
 - Every one of us is to help grow the body of Christ.
 1 Cor. 12:21-26
 - We all supply something different to the work of the Lord, that is what makes it work efficiently.
 Eph. 4:15-16

- The sandal.
 - A sandal is just a couple of straps holding on a sole.
 - We are to get rid of the things that would prevent us from growing. 1 Pet. 2:1-2
 - We will never be able to be productive Christians unless we grow.

Heb. 5:12-14; 2 Pet. 3:18

- The tight shoe.
 - This shoe fits one who has a problem with giving.
 - The Lord requires that we bring an offering according to our blessing. 1 Cor. 16:1-2;
 2 Cor. 9:7-13
 - Giving is much more than the offering, but also assisting others. Gal. 6:10

- The Sunday shoe.
 - The kind of shoe we wear only on Sunday's.
 - But we are to be faithful to God every day.
 - We are to carry our cross daily. Luke 9:23
 - We are to study our Bible daily. Acts 17:11
 - We are to shine as lights daily. Matt. 5:14-16

- The work shoe.
 - This shoe may not be the most beautiful, nor the most popular. Matt. 7:13-14
 - But God has promised that those who wear such will be rewarded. Heb. 6:10; 1 Cor. 15:58
 - We must keep our spiritual work shoes polished.
 John 14:15; James 2:18
