    - **XVE must hear and learn this good seed. John 6:44-45**

  - + Vs. 39 The enemy is the devil and his doctrines. 1 Tim. 4:1-3
    - \*The devil also has his workers. 2 Cor. 11:13-15; 1 John 2:19
  - + Vs. 40 The harvest will occur at the end of the age. 2 Thess. 1:6-10
    - \*The Lord has not forgotten His promise.
      2 Pet. 3:9

  - + Vs. 41 There will even be a removal among His kingdom. *Rev. 3:16* 
    - Christians should know better, if we are tares we will be made known.

    - For this reason we strive to be wheat. Dan. 12:3; Rev. 21:3-5
