

The reason for this parable.

- As with other parables, a request was the reason for this one. Luke 12:13-15
- Many people measure they life on what they possess. 1 Tim. 6:17, 18-19
- But money is one of those things that we will never be satisfied with. *Eccl. 5:10-15; Prov. 23:4-5*

- The parable given:
 - The selfish view of those who have much.
 Luke 12:16-17
 - Many say "If I only had this, I would do that".
 Luke 16:10
 - His solution, "greater storehouses". Luke 12:18
 - Rather than seeing whom to help, his view was focused only on him. *Eccl.* 11:1-2, 6; Prov. 19:17

- The parable given:
 - The rich man's goal. Luke 12:19
 - Understand that there is nothing wrong with saving for later in life. *Prov.* 27:23-24
 - But he fail to see that life is uncertain. Luke 12:20
 - There is no guarantee of a tomorrow.

James 4:13-14; Eccl. 3:19-20

- The parable given:
 - The true loss in this story. Luke 12:21
 - After death, what use will all earthly wealth do? Matt. 16:24

- What we learn from this parable.
 - Make the things of God priority.
 Luke 12:22-31; Ps. 37:25; Prov. 10:3a; 3:9-10
 - We will not be able to take anything from this world. 1 Tim. 6:6-11; 4:8; Phil. 4:11-13
 - True riches are those that are eternal in heaven.
 1 Pet. 1:3-5; Matt. 6:19-21
