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Col 2:18a, 23

Let no one keep defrauding you of your prize by delighting in self-abasement... These are matters which have, to be sure, the appearance of wisdom in self-made religion and self-abasement and severe treatment of the body, <u>but are of no value</u> against fleshly indulgence.

- Paul warns against observing days in a religious fashion.
 Gal. 4:10-11
 - We must understand that there are 2 kinds of days, holy days and holidays.
 - Holidays are not holy days.
 Col. 2:16-17; 1 Kings 12:32-33; 13:34
 - We are commanded to observe the things that the Lord has commanded. *Matt. 28:18-20; Rev. 22:14 KJV*

- Understand that we are not opposing:
 - The social/recreation aspects of the Easter holiday. Rom. 14:2-6, 18-20
 - The resurrection of Jesus. Matt. 28:5-6; 1 Pet. 1:3
 - The preaching of the resurrection.

 1 Cor. 15:1-4; Acts 2:22-24

- How does Jesus want us to remember His death?
 - Not by recreations of His passion or human ordained services.
 Matt. 15:8-9; Col. 2:20-22
 - But by a simple meal of unleavened bread and fruit of the vine. Luke 22:14-20; 1 Cor. 11:23-26
 - Such remembrance is to be done every first day of the week,
 not once a year. Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 11:20
