– Holidays are not holy days.

– We are commanded to observe the things that the Lord has commanded. ***Matt. 28:18-20; Rev. 22:14 KJV***

1 Cor. 15:1-4; Acts 2:22-24



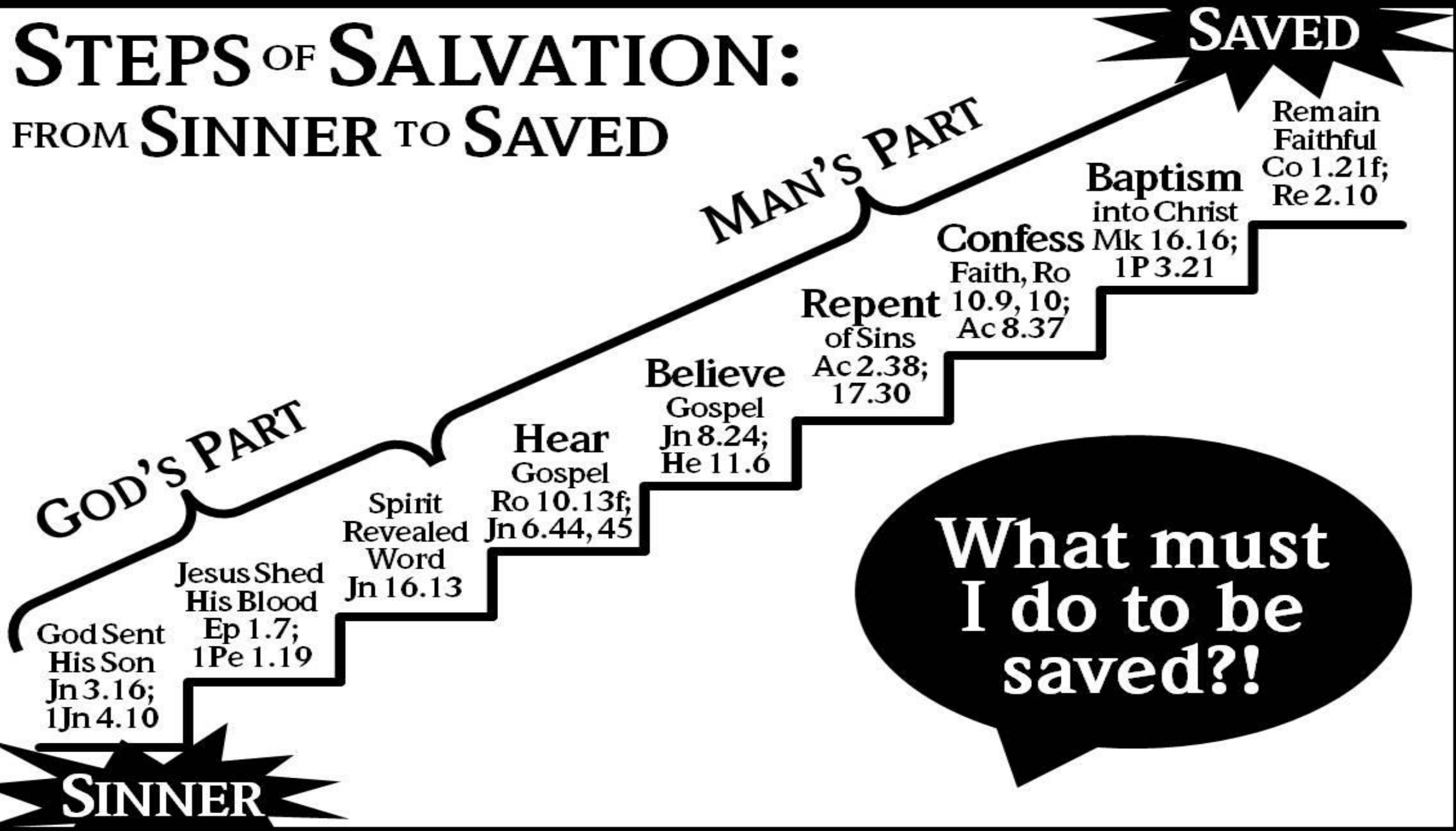
Do THIS In My Memory?

- How does Jesus want us to remember His death?
 - Not by recreations of His passion or human ordained services.
Matt. 15:8-9; Col. 2:20-22
 - But by a simple meal of unleavened bread and fruit of the vine. *Luke 22:14-20; 1 Cor. 11:23-26*
 - Such remembrance is to be done every first day of the week, not once a year. *Acts 20:7; 1 Cor. 11:20*
