

- What is the Lord's Supper?
 - A memorial.
 - A proclamation of Jesus' death. 1 Cor. 11:24-26
 - The bread represents His body and the fruit of the vine His blood.
 - A covenant meal. Luke 22:19-20
 - A covenant meal we share with the Lord in the kingdom.
 Matt. 26:26-29
 - Covenants often sealed with a meal. Gen. 31:46, 54;
 Exo. 24:9-11

- The components:
 - Unleavened bread. Such was used during Passover.
 Exo. 12:14-15
 - Fruit of the vine. Not same as wine. Matt. 26:29
 - The container is not part of the elements.

 Luke 22:17-20

- When was it done?
 - Upon de first day of the week.

Acts 20:7

- But it does not say every first day of the week. Cf. *Exo.* 20:8
- Early Christians meet regularly. 1 Cor. 16:1-2; Heb. 10:25
- When we assemble together. 1 Cor. 11:17-18, 20, 33

- How are we to observe it?
 - Examining oneself, not others.
 - 1 Cor. 11:27-30
 - Unworthy manner means understanding the reason we are here for. Note vs. 29
 - But it could also apply to one's daily life, can't live like the world and expect to retain fellowship (communion) with the Lord. 2 Cor. 6:14-18
