## "Your Sins Will Find You Out"

You may remember hearing a few years back about the Penn State University scandal. Fox news reported that Jerry Sandusky, former assistant football coach, sexually abused ten young boys in 15 years. It started with the accusation of one child, and then past skeletons began popping up. According to media reports, some school officials actually knew about Sandusky's activities, but apparently their priorities weren't straight.
